Haftarah for Shabbat Naso

1 Kings 8:54-63

In this week's Torah portion we hear the Priestly Blessing and read about the consecration of the Tabernacle in the wilderness. Our Haftarah is Solomon's blessing of the people at the dedication of the Temple in Jerusalem.

Now as Solomon finished offering all this prayer and plea to the Eternal, he arose from before the altar of the Eternal, where he had knelt with hands outstretched toward heaven.

And he stood and blessed all the assembly of Israel with a loud voice, saying, "Blessed be the Eternal who has given rest to the people Israel, according to all that God promised. Not one word has failed of all this good promise, which Adonai spoke by Moses, God's servant.

The Eternal our God be with us, as God was with our ancestors. May Adonai not leave us or forsake us that our hearts may incline to God, to walk in all God's ways and to keep the commandments, the statutes, and the rules, which God commanded our ancestors.

Let these words of mine, with which I have pleaded before the Eternal, be near to the Eternal our God day and night, and may Adonai maintain the cause of God's servant and the cause of the people Israel, as each day requires, that all the peoples of the earth may know that the Eternal is God; there is no other.

Let your heart therefore be wholly true to the Eternal our God, walking in God's statutes and keeping the commandments, as at this day."

Then the king, and all Israel with him, offered sacrifice before the Eternal.

Solomon offered as peace offerings to the Eternal 22,000 oxen and 120,000 sheep. So the king and all the people of Israel dedicated the house of the Eternal.
