My Vindicator is at hand who dares contend with me? Let us stand up together! Who would be my opponent? Let him approach me! Lo, the Eternal God will help me, who can get a verdict against me? They shall all wear out like a garment, the moth shall consume them. Who among you reveres the Eternal and heeds the voice of God's servant?
