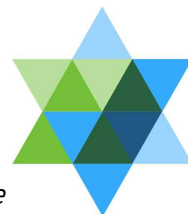

Chanukah Instructions

The only essential element of a Chanukah celebration is the lighting of the chanukiah after sunset.

To set up the Chanukiah:

- The chanukiah should be set with the equivalent number of candles to the day of Chanukah plus one candle to act as the shamash (lighting candle).
- The candles should be placed in the chanukiah from right to left, with the *shamash* in the special holder.

To light the Chanukiah:

- Light the *shamash*.
- Recite the two blessings ending *l'hadlik ner shel Chanukah* and *she'asah nisim la'avoteinu ba'yamim ha'heim u'va'zman ha'zeh*. (page 375 of the siddur).
- On the first night also recite the *shehechianu*. (page 375 of the siddur).
- Light the candles using the *shamash*, moving from left to right (i.e. the 'newest' candle first).
- Put the *shamash* back in its place
- Recite *Ha'Nerot Halalu* – We kindle these lights. (page 376 of the siddur).
- *Sing Maoz Tzur* – Rock of ages. (page 376 of the siddur).
