How did Jewish communities respond to the revival of classical forms in Renaissance Italy in the sixteenth century, and to the larger-scale, rhetorical language of the Baroque, which spread from Rome to northern Europe over the next 150 years? We will look at peculiarities of planning in the Sephardic synagogues of Venice and Padua, their influence in Amsterdam and London, and at the richly ornamented prayer-halls of Poland-Lithuania.
