Shabbat at Alyth

Throughout Jewish history, Shabbat has been at the heart of Jewish life, a distinctive and special time, different from the working week.

At Alyth, we strive to uphold this holiness of Shabbat, with learning and multiple services to meet the needs of the community. Please help us to ensure that everyone is able to pray and participate by thinking about the needs of those around you.

When we want to show appreciation during a service, it is traditional not to applaud but to shout 'yasher koach' or 'sh'koach', which means 'strength to you.' We ask that you please refrain from applauding, but join in this greeting.

Together we make *Kiddush* (the prayer sanctifying the day) with wine and challah on both Erev Shabbat and Shabbat morning. We ask that you do not start eating until the blessings have been recited.

To help us to separate Shabbat from the rest of the week, we ask that you please switch off your mobile phone, and do not take photographs or smoke on the premises on Shabbat.

In making Shabbat special, we rely on the contribution of many of our members. Thank you to everybody who has helped this Shabbat, including our members' choirs, wardens, those who have set out flowers and *Kiddush*, and our volunteers on security duty.

(Jeremiah 9:22-10:12)

Let not the rich man glory in his riches.

But only in this should one glory: In his earnest devotion to Me.

For I the Eternal act with kindness, justice, and equity in the world; for in these I delight declares the Eternal.

Lo, days are coming declares the Eternal when I will take note of everyone circumcised in the foreskin of Egypt, Judah, Edom, the Ammonites, Moab, and all the desert dwellers who have the hair of their temples clipped. For all these nations are uncircumcised, but all the House of Israel are uncircumcised of heart.

Hear the word which the Eternal has spoken to you, O House of Israel!

Thus said the Eternal: do not learn to go the way of the nations, and do not be dismayed by portents in the sky; let the nations be dismayed by them!

For the laws of the nations are delusions: for it is the work of a craftsman's hands. He cuts down a tree in the forest with an axe, he adorns it with silver and gold, he fastens it with nails and hammer, so that it does not totter.

They are like a scarecrow in a cucumber patch, they cannot speak.

They have to be carried, for they cannot walk.

Be not afraid of them, for they can do no harm; nor is it in them to do any good. O Eternal, there is none like You! You are great and Your name is great in power. Who would not revere You, O Sovereign of the nations? For that is Your due, since among all the wise of the nations and among all their royalty there is none like You. But they are both dull and foolish; their doctrine is but delusion; it is a piece of wood, silver beaten flat, that is brought from Tarshish, and gold from Uphaz, the work of a craftsman and the goldsmith's hands; their clothing is blue and purple, all of them are the work of skilled men.

But the Eternal is truly God: the Eternal is a living God, the everlasting King. At His wrath, the earth quakes, and nations cannot endure God's rage. Thus shall you say to them: Let the gods, who did not make heaven and earth, perish from the earth and from under these heavens. The Eternal made the earth by God's might, established the world by the Eternal's wisdom, and by God's understanding stretched out the skies.
