THE REUBENITES AND THE GADITES OWNED CATTLE IN VERY GREAT NUMBERS (Num 32:1). This relates to what Scripture says: A WISE PERSON'S MIND TENDS TOWARD THE RIGHT, A FOOL'S TOWARD THE LEFT (Ecclesiastes 10:2)...

A WISE PERSON'S MIND TENDS TOWARD THE RIGHT - this refers to the righteous who apply their hearts to Torah, which is from the right; as it says, FROM GOD'S RIGHT HAND WAS A FIERY LAW GIVEN TO THEM (Deut 33:2).

A FOOL'S TOWARD THE LEFT – this is the wicked, who set their minds on getting rich; as it says, IN HER LEFT HAND ARE RICHES AND HONOUR (Prov 3:16).

Another explanation: A WISE PERSON'S MIND TENDS TOWARD THE RIGHT – this is Moses. A FOOL'S TOWARD THE LEFT – This is the Reubenites and the Gadites, who made the main thing unimportant, and the less important thing the main thing, for they cherished their property more than human life, saying to Moses WE WILL BUILD HERE SHEEPFOLDS FOR OUR FLOCKS AND TOWNS FOR OUR CHILDREN (Num 32:16). Moses said to them, "That is not right. Rather, do the more important things first. First, build cities for your children, and afterwards folds for your flocks...

The Holy One said to them, "As you have shown greater love for your cattle than for human souls, by your life, there will be no blessing in it." Of them it says AN ESTATE ACQUIRED IN HASTE AT THE OUTSET WILL NOT BE BLESSED IN THE END (Proverbs 20:21). And thus it says DO NOT TOIL TO GAIN WEALTH; HAVE THE SENSE TO DESIST. (Proverbs 23:4). And: Who is rich? Those who are satisfied with their lot. As it says ENJOY THE FRUIT OF YOUR LABOURS; BE HAPPY AND PROSPER (Psalm 128:2).

Jeremiah 2:23-29; 3:4; 4:1-2
