Haftarah Shabbat Rosh Chodesh

Isaiah 66: 15-23

See, the Eternal is coming with fire—God's chariots are like a whirlwind—to vent God's anger in fury, God's rebuke in flaming fire. For with fire will the Eternal contend, with God's sword, against all flesh; and many shall be the slain of the Eternal.

Those who sanctify and purify themselves to enter the groves, imitating one in the centre, eating the flesh of the swine, the reptile, and the mouse, shall one and all come to an end—declares the Eternal. For I (know) their deeds and purposes.

The time has come to gather all the nations and tongues; they shall come and behold My glory. I will set a sign among them, and send from them survivors to the nations: to Tarshish, Pul, and Lud—that draw the bow—to Tubal, Javan, and the distant coasts, that have never heard My fame nor beheld My glory. They shall declare My glory among these nations.

And out of all the nations, said the Eternal, they shall bring all your brothers on horses, in chariots and drays, on mules and dromedaries, to Jerusalem My holy mountain as an offering to the Eternal—just as the Israelites bring an offering in a pure vessel to the House of the Eternal.
