Smoking, Food, Dress and Phones

Smoking is not permitted at the Sternberg Centre or at Alyth. We also ask that no food should be brought into the marquee at any time, appropriate dress should be worn and that mobile phones are set to silent mode.

Service Locations

We are holding services at both the Sternberg Centre and the Synagogue in Alyth Gardens on first day *Rosh Hashanah*. All services for Second Day *Rosh Hashanah* take place at the Synagogue. All services for *Yom Kippur* will take place at the Sternberg Centre.

Free transport between Alyth Gardens and the Sternberg Centre (and back!)

On first day *Rosh Hashanah* we will be running a free minibus shuttle, starting at **09:45** from the Sternberg Centre, with the final shuttle at **12:30** leaving the Synagogue. The shuttle will run every fifteen minutes. Children under 13 must be accompanied by an adult to use the coach. The service will be operated by Davian Coach Company.

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Pre High Holy Days

Services and study through Elul

Elul, the month preceding *Rosh Hashanah*, is traditionally a time of preparation for the High Holy Days. Among the rituals we will include in our Shabbat services are the sounding of the *shofar* at the morning service, which serves as a wake up call to those preparing for the period, and the recitation of Psalm 27 in our services.

Unlock Your High Holy Days Voice Thursday 11 September, 20:00 - 22:00

Learn techniques to enable you to get the best out of your voice. For many people the ability to sing well eludes them. However for most, given the right guidance, they can unlock the hidden potential in their larynx and enjoy the wonderful thrill of singing along 'in tune'. Join Viv Bellos and Cantor Cheryl Wunch who together will give you the technical know how and teach you some beautiful melodies to make your High Holy Days experience even more meaningful.

Gateway to Judaism: The Jewish Calendar Wednesday 17 September, 20:00 - 21:45

Alyth's introduction to Judaism Course begins its year with a look at the Jewish calendar, and especially the origins, themes and motifs of the High Holy Days. Gateway is open to any Alyth member who would like to ensure their Jewish knowledge has firm foundations, as well as those converting to Judaism. With Rabbi Josh Levy and Jon Epstein.

Rosh Hashanah Talmud Class with Gilad Kariv Thursday 18 September, 13:00 - 14:15

A very special session of our welcoming *Talmud* class, taught by Rabbi Gilad Kariv, Executive Director of the Israel Movement for Reform and Progressive Judaism (IMPJ), and Rabbi Mark Goldsmith, on the theme of *Rosh Hashanah*. Rabbi Gilad Kariv will also be our guest on *Erev Shabbat*, 19 September.

Lo va-shamayim hi - It is not in heaven (Deuteronomy 30:12) Parallel Adult and Family Shiurim Saturday 20 September, 09:15 - 10:15

Prepare for *Rosh Hashanah* with the first of our new parallel *shiurim*.

The 'adult' *shiur*, to which all members are welcome, will take place with Rabbi Josh Levy, offering text study based on the *parashat hashavua* (weekly portion).

New for this year – once a month, running in parallel with the adult *shiur*, Lynette Sunderland will offer a learning session for children on the same theme, so parents and children can discuss together what they have learned. This month both *shiurim* will take as their starting point the important verse in this week's portion – 'It (*Torah*) is not in heaven'.

Selichot

Saturday 20 September, from 20:00

This year, we will begin our *Selichot* observance with a film and discussion on a theme related to the High Holy Days. There will be light refreshments served as we transition into our reflective choral service.

The film will begin at 20:00 and the service will begin at 22:15.

Special pre-Rosh Hashanah learning morning for all ages

Join us for a special *Rosh Hashanah* morning to prepare to welcome in 5775 - including songs, arts and craft, and cooking. With options for children of all ages and parallel adult sessions. The morning will also include a 'Big Bang Rosh Hashanah' rehearsal, with the opportunity to learn new melodies before *Rosh Hashanah* morning.

EREV ROSH HASHANAH FIRST DAY (Wednesday 24 September)

At the Sternberg Centre

18:30 Service

(Marquee)

The Jewish Year begins with our service for *Erev Rosh Hashanah.* Join the clergy team as we use the new draft edition of our Days of Awe *Machzor* for the first time. **Copies of the book will be available at the service, so there is no need to bring your own** *Machzor*, and there will be opportunities later in the High Holy Days to share your feedback.

All of our High Holy Days sermons this year will consider tradition and response, building Judaism now and for the future. This evening, the sermon will be given by Rabbi Mark Goldsmith.

ROSH HASHANAH FIRST DAY (Thursday 25 September)

Services and learning opportunities at the Sternberg Centre

10:15 Crèche

(Room 1 - Manor House)

10:30 Marquee Service (Marquee)

Shacharit will be led by Rabbi Mark Goldsmith and members of the community. The sermon will be given by Cantor Cheryl Wunch. *Musaf* will be led by Rabbi Josh Levy.

10:45 Kollot (Old Synagogue - Manor House)

Kollot is a sung service which takes place in the round, largely in Hebrew, and which encourages lay participation and communal singing. Led by Kollot members with our clergy. Kollot will join the Marquee service after the *Torah* service for the sermon and *Musaf*.

<u>School Years 5 & 6</u>

11:45 So why are we celebrating the New Year NOW?

(Beit Limmud, Kitchen Side)

Isn't it odd that we celebrate the new year in September?! Believe it or not, we are not the only ones to celebrate a new year at a peculiar time. Come to this session to explore some of the similarities and differences that exist within other cultures and their new years celebrations. Hear from a panel of our younger members, who will speak about their achievements and experiences of the last year in social action, leadership and Jewish identity. After the panel discussion, there will be a guided reflection exercise, which will allow young people to think about their goals, aims and resolutions for the year ahead. KOL NIDRE (Friday 3 October)

At the Sternberg Centre

The fast of Yom Kippur commences at 18:18

19:00 Kol Nidre

(Marquee)

With the sound of *Kol Nidre* we join together in prayer.

Then

Continuation of service (Marquee)

The Classical Service in the Marquee. After the playing of *Kol Nidre* on the cello by Daniel Ledermann, the service will continue, led by Rabbi Mark Goldsmith. The *Kol Nidre* sermon will be given by Rabbi Professor Tony Bayfield CBE.

Kollot Nidre

(Old Synagogue - Manor House)

After we have witnessed *Kol Nidre*, join Rabbi Josh Levy for a service which continues our liturgy for this evening in Kollot style. We will rejoin the Marquee service for the sermon.

Kabbalat Kol Nidre

(Drawing Room - Manor House)

Join Cantor Cheryl Wunch for this reflective, meditative service where we will explore the connections between *Kabbalat Shabbat* and *Yom Kippur* through prayer, discussion, and song. We will rejoin the Marquee service for the sermon.

School Years 3-6

11:00 Terrifying Tefillah – getting it ready (Room 2 - Manor House)

We have just one hour to prepare a scapegoat and a cruelty free chicken for the Terrifying Tefillah service. Come and help make Terrifying Tefillah as gory and realistic as possible. Led by Alyth *madrichim* (leaders).

12:00 Terrifying Tefillah for Yom Kippur (Old Synagogue - Manor House)

11:00 Bigger Fish to Fry

<u>School Years 10-13</u>

12:00 Teen Talmud for Yom Kippur (Room of Prayer - Manor House 1st Floor)

We all know that *Yom Kippur* is about atoning for our sins, but for some of us, it can be hard to really believe all of this stuff. Join Cantor Cheryl Wunch for a discussion about God and faith, and how to make *Yom Kippur* meaningful for you, no matter what you might believe right now.

MUSAF

13:30 approx Musaf Service and Avodah (Marquee)

The dramatic service in which we remember the Temple service for *Yom Kippur*. Led by Rabbi Josh Levy.

13:30 Musaf Meditation (Beit Limmud)

When the heart rests in a space of transition, it is close to its core and closer to the Divine. Vocal vowel meditation is a profound spiritual group practice, evoking a deep sense of peace and integrity. This practice will be followed by deep relaxation and rest meditation to allow stillness to infuse our inner *Yom Kippur* journey. Led by Mika Hadar-Borthwick teacher of Jewish techniques of meditation for over 30 years.

14:30 approx Continuation of Musaf Service (Marquee)

Remembering our Jewish martyrs in a contemplative service with Rabbi Professor Tony Bayfield CBE and Viv Bellos.

14:30 Choice of study sessions:

1984 versus Divergent (Beit Limmud)

In George Orwell's '1984' everything you do is judged by Big Brother. In Veronica Roth's 'Divergent' series your personal qualities are set when you are sixteen and heaven help you if you diverge from them. Which blockbuster dystopian world is least like the message of *Yom Kippur*? Which is closest to it? Could we live with either? A discussion with Rabbi Mark Goldsmith, guided by texts from the books and Jewish literature, and from our personal experiences.

A Journey through our Musical Seasons (Drawing Room - Manor House)

Nusach (chanting melodies) is a unique language that gives us musical signposts throughout our year. Join Cantor Cheryl Wunch as we explore the different melodies that Jews traditionally use to signify different holidays and festivals. No musical experience or knowledge is necessary.

Building fences and opening doors: Status in Jewish tradition

(Old Synagogue Annex - Manor House)

How do we decide who is Jewish and who is not? What requirements should we place on those who want to join the Jewish people? Is inherited status a fundamentally racist concept in a modern religion? Join Rabbi Josh Levy to explore the challenges of status in modern Progressive Judaism and in classical Jewish sources.

Rabbi Josh is leading the Assembly of Reform Rabbis Working Group on Inherited Status, and will be teaching a four week course on Jewish Status as part of the new Leo Baeck College Lehrhaus, launching in October 2014 (for more information http://bit.ly/LBC_Lehrhaus_2014-15).

MINCHAH

15:45 approx Minchah Service (Marquee)

Our afternoon service in which we hear Torah and the Book of Jonah. Led by Rabbi Mark Goldsmith and Lynette Sunderland.

16:00 Crèche (Room 1 - Manor House) See page 4 for details.

16:00 Ruach Chadashah (Drawing Room - Manor House)

A service built from creative readings in English collected for *Machzor Ruach Chadashah* which address the individual on *Yom Kippur*. Led by Julia Brown and Nicola Goldsmith.

16:00 Minchah for Families (Beit Limmud)

What is *Yom Kippur* afternoon supposed to feel like? Often it can feel a bit tired or flat – especially if you are just sat at home.

In this one-hour service for the whole family with Rabbi Josh Levy and Cantor Cheryl Wunch it will feel musical and inspiring, including new and familiar melodies and an abridged version of the Book of Jonah.

YIZKOR

17:15 approx Yizkor Service (Marquee)

Our memorial service to remember loved ones who are no longer with us.

Please note that there will be no admission during the *Yizkor* service once it has begun. The service will begin with the singing of Psalm 23 on page 624, and end with the mourners *Kaddish*. We ask that you please remain in the marquee until *Kaddish* has been recited.

Followed by the final sermon of *Yom Kippur*, given by Rabbi Mark Goldsmith

NEILAH

18:15 approx Neilah Service (Marquee)

Our concluding service for *Yom Kippur* – as the Gates of Repentance draw to a close. Led by Rabbi Josh Levy and Cantor Cheryl Wunch.

18:15 Kavanah Yoga for Neilah (Drawing Room - Manor House)

Join Maxine Levy to fuse the techniques of yoga with key texts and themes from the liturgy of the *Neilah* service, to exit *Yom Kippur* mindfully and spiritually. No special clothing or agility needed. For the body and soul. This session will end in time to join the service in the Marquee for the final blast of the *Shofar* and *Havdalah*.

18:15 "Closing the Gates" (Beit Limmud)

For all young people

Yom Kippur is almost over but we still have some time before the gates close. In this session we ask you to bring a pinch of creativity as we picture our hopes for the coming year with art, talk and stories. Led by David Yehuda Stern, Sam Brunner and Rabbi Mark Goldsmith.

19:23 Havdalah and fast breaking

We will be making *Havdalah*, the concluding ceremony for *Yom Kippur*, in front of the *bimah* in our Marquee, led by our young people.

As in previous years, food and drink for breaking the fast will be available in the *Beit Limmud* building. In addition, a light supper will be available for those people who wish to sit and chat a while longer.
