

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Our Team for High Holy Days 5778

The programme of activities that we offer over the High Holy Days is unparalleled anywhere in Europe, and is made possible because of the efforts of our Rabbis, our wider staff team, our volunteers and lay leaders.

We are delighted that new member of our rabbinic team, Rabbi Hannah Kingston, will be with us in time for the High Holy Days. RabbiHannah will join our Rabbinic Partners, Rabbi Mark Goldsmith and Rabbi Josh Levy. We are also grateful to Rabbi Colin Eimer who is once again contributing to our services and learning throughout the period.

During the High Holy Days we will also welcome **Rabbi Dr Deborah Kahn-Harris**, Principal of Leo Baeck College, on second day Rosh Hashanah, and **Rabbi Laura Janner-Klausner**, Senior Rabbi to Reform Judaism, on Shabbat Shuvah and Yom Kippur.

Our offerings for families and young people will be run by members of our Youth and Education Hub: **Sam Brunner, Mike Mendoza** and **Chloe Kimmel**, along with Alyth madrichim. Services for younger children will be run by the Rabbis, Youth and Education team, and **Tor Alter**, Alyth Kindergarten's newly appointed Head Teacher.

Our Head of Music and Arts, **Katie Hainbach**, leads our High Holy Days choir. **Lynette Sunderland**, Director of Welfare and Life Cycle, will be with us on *Yom Kippur*, providing care and learning throughout the day. We are also blessed to have the contribution on *Yom Kippur* of the Alyth Jewish Mindfulness Meditation team.

We are grateful for the hard work of our facilities team, Alan Lee, Dee Payne, Ray Elkan and Bob Morely, who, under the management of Community Director, Adam Martin, are available to support you throughout this period.

Everything that we do at Alyth is built on the commitment and dedication of our volunteers and lay leaders who give their time and energy to ensure that this period runs smoothly. The High Holy Days are no exception.

Machzor: On *Rosh Hashanah* we will be using a draft of the new Reform Judaism *Machzor*, which will be provided.

On *Kol Nidre* and *Yom Kippur* we will use the current Days of Awe *Machzor*. All those attending services should bring their own copy as none are provided. Copies are available to purchase from the Alyth office.

Smoking, Food, Dress and Phones: Smoking is not permitted at the Sternberg Centre or at Alyth. We ask that no food be brought into the marquee at any time. Appropriate dress should be worn and mobile phones set to silent mode or, even better, switched off.

Service Locations: All services for *Erev Rosh Hashanah* and Second Day *Rosh Hashanah* take place at Alyth. We are holding services at both the Sternberg Centre and the Synagogue in Alyth Gardens on First Day *Rosh Hashanah* and *Yom Kippur* morning. All services for *Kol Nidre* and *Yom Kippur* afternoon take place at the Sternberg Centre. Our volunteer stewards will help you find service locations.

ELUL - LEARN WITH US

Elul Half Hour Fridays 25 August, 1, 8, 15 September, 17:45 Saturdays 26 August, 2, 9, 16 September, 09:45

The return of our popular programme of *Cheshbon HaNefesh* ("accounting for the soul") in advance of the High Holy Days. Join us for these brief times of reflection, study and contemplation before each of Alyth's Shabbat services during Elul. You are welcome to attend every session, or to simply drop in when you wish, and no pre-booking is necessary. We only ask that when you come, you try to join at the start of the session.

This year, we will explore the seven characteristics of a wise person according to Pirkei Avot (Sayings of the Sages) 5:10 and will reflect on how these qualities can be part of our lives in 5778. See future weekly emails, Around Alyth and the Alyth website for the full programme.

Progressive Rabbinic Decision Making Monday 4 September, 20:00-21:45

As part of the MA in Applied Rabbinic Theology, fourth year Rabbinic Students at Leo Baeck College spend a term studying "Progressive Rabbinic Decision Making" with Rabbi Josh. How do Progressive Rabbis make decisions about their practice, and guide the practice in their communities? In this session, we will think about the question of *yom tov sheni* - the second day of festivals. Why do Reform communities not keep a second day, except on Rosh Hashanah, and are we right not to?

Judaism - The Essentials Wednesdays 6 & 13 September, 20:00-21:45

Essentials is our programme of short courses for all those who want to ensure that their Judaism has firm foundations. If one of your goals for 5778 is to improve your Jewish knowledge, then this is the course for you. A more intimate service for *Rosh Hashanah* evening with Rabbi Mark and Katie Hainbach. There will be space for reflection on the meaning of beginning a new year using our traditional liturgy, and creative pieces in our new *Machzor*.

Shacharit and Torah Service

Our Choral and Kollot services will begin separately for the *Shacharit* and *Torah* services, before coming together for the sermon.

Please note the slightly earlier start time for the service in the marquee.

Both services will be using the draft edition of our new *Rosh Hashanah Machzor.* Copies of the book will be available at the service, so there is no need to bring your own *Machzor.* (You will still need to do so on *Yom Kippur*).

10:15 Choral Service (Marquee)

10:30 Kollot (Alyth's High Holy Days Synagogue)

Our parallel service which takes place in the round, largely in Hebrew, and which encourages lay participation and communal singing.

Sermon

12:30 Approximately (after the sermon) Musaf Service

The *Musaf* (Additional) Service is the setting for most of the liturgy which is specific to the festival day. On Rosh Hashanah, this includes the singing of Un'taneh Tokef, and the blowing of the *Shofar*. This year, there are three options for *Musaf Rosh Hashanah*.

Choral Musaf (Marquee)

Our choral service with the beautiful sound of the Alyth choir, including hearing the sound of *shofar*. Led by Rabbi Colin.

Musical Musaf (Alyth's High Holy Days Synagogue)

A special Musaf with Rabbi Josh which will include a musical journey through the *malchuyot*, *zichronot* and *shofarot*, including hearing the sound of *shofar*. Leave *Rosh Hashanah* morning uplifted by joyful song and prayer.

London 5778 - Fears and Realities (Drawing Room)

Rabbi Mark will be joined by the Barnet Borough Commander for the Metropolitan Police, Simon Rose, and Inspector Jason Moseley, Jewish Community Liaison Officer, to speak about their unique perspective on London for the coming year. What is your personal motivation for repentance this year? The sages argue that not all forms of repentance are created equal. For those of us motivated by fear, the impending punishment is the driving force. For those of us motivated by love, an orientation towards a life of good is the ultimate goal. According to Reish Lakish (Yoma 86b) this is true repentance which offers us the chance to grow morally by transforming our sins into merits, consequently redeeming a part of ourselves that previously led us astray. Tefillah Track

13:45 approx Musaf: Avodah Service (Marquee)

The dramatic service in which we remember the Temple service for *Yom Kippur*. Led by Rabbi Mark.

15:00 approx Musaf: Martyrology Service (Marquee)

Remembering our Jewish martyrs in a contemplative service with Rabbi Colin and Viv Bellos.

16:00 approx Minchah Service (Marquee)

Our afternoon service in which we hear *Torah* and the Book of Jonah. Led by Rabbi Josh.

Meditation and Reflection Track

For those who need something deeper for the soul.

14:00 - 14:55 Kavannah Avodah (Room of Prayer - Manor House 1st Floor)

Join Maxine Levy and Rabbi Colin for a meditative journey giving space and connection to the sound of self, inspired by the practices of the High Priest of the Temple in Jerusalem on Yom Kippur, taking you to a place of At-One-Ment.

15:00 - 15:55 Hitboddedut - Rabbi Nachman of Bratslav's Spritual Practice (Room of Prayer - Manor House 1st Floor)

Rabbi Nachman of Bratslav (1772-1810) wrote that we should "set aside time each day to meditate and pray alone in a room or a meadow to express your innermost thoughts and feelings and personal prayers to God." His followers called this practice Hitboddedut. Join Rabbi Mark to experience this practice, concentrating individually on the struggles in our lives and finding the peace and personal space to begin to overcome them.

16:00 –17:15 Minchah Meditation (Room of Prayer - Manor House 1st Floor)

When the heart rests in a space of transition, it is close to its core and closer to the Divine. Vocal vowel meditation is a profound spiritual group practice, evoking a deep sense of peace and integrity. This practice will be followed by deep relaxation and rest meditation to allow stillness to infuse our inner Yom Kippur journey. Led by Mika Borthwick.

Study Track

For those looking for mental stimulation and challenge through the afternoon .

14:00 –14:55 The Sugyot Every Reform Jew Should Know - Yom Kippur Special

(Akiva Moadon)

The Musaf service begins with *U'ntaneh tokef*, with imagery of fear and trembling before God. In this special Yom Kippur edition of Rabbi Josh's regular series of Talmud shiurim, we will look at a sugya in which the rabbis explore the concept of "fear of heaven". A sugya is a discrete section of the Talmud, normally containing a weaving together of stories, rabbinic statements and biblical commentary on a shared theme. In these shiurim, we look at passages which are particularly important, theologically challenging or entertaining. You do not need to have studied Talmud before, or be able to read Hebrew, just come ready to grapple with the ideas of the Sages.

15:00 - 15:55 Food for thought (Akiva Moadon)

How do we deal with the overwhelming presence of food in our lives and in our Jewish ritual? From our earliest days, through our teenage years, and into adulthood, our eating habits are deeply intertwined with who we are as people and who we are as Jews. On Yom Kippur, the one day of the year when we are not defined by our culinary desires, join Rabbi Hannah as we ask the question: do we eat our food, or does our food eat us?

16:00 -17.15 Jonah the Jew, Christian and Muslim (Alyth's High Holy Days Synagogue)

On Yom Kippur afternoon we hear the Book of Jonah. The most effective prophet in the Bible changes the behaviour of a city with just five words. Jonah has a special place in Judaism, Christianity and Islam, where he is known as Yunus. Join Rabbi Mark, Martin Palmer and Remona Aly to explore the points of contact and difference in our three faiths' Jonah traditions. Martin Palmer is Secretary General of the Alliance of Religions and Conservation. An Anglican religious historian, he is a frequent contributor on radio and television, helping to explain the development of religious thought and practice, with a speciality in Chinese Christianity. Remona Aly is a journalist and commentator who writes for the Guardian and regularly presents Radio Pause for Thought and Radio 4's Understood. She is Director of Communications of the Exploring Islam Foundation.

Chevruta Track

Chevruta is a traditional Jewish form of study, reading and discussing texts in pairs, or in small groups. This Yom Kippur afternoon, we offer the opportunity to study texts and materials prepared by Rabbi Laura Janner-Klausner, and taken from the latest module of Reform Judaism's inspirational learning programme, L'Chaim, which is about our engagement with Social Justice.

A rabbi will be on hand to help you to find a study partner, to guide you through the material, and to help you to access the texts (which will be in Hebrew and English, so no previous knowledge or Hebrew is necessary).

Together we will explore the nature of Jewish social obligation, the difference between Social Action and Social Justice, and what this has to do with Yom Kippur!
