Diving Deep Through Liturgical Chant

Join Kohenet Rachel Rose Reid & Tzova (Kohenet Initiate) Yael Tischler for an exploration of how chants drawn from Shabbat liturgy can create an embodied, grounded, transformative experience of Jewish prayer. Using chants from the north American Kohenet Hebrew Priestess Institute, we will call in a deeply held, spiritually rich circle of song.
