


A Jonah Experience

He paid for his ticket and boarded the ship, sailing away from the task God had given him. Then God cast a great wind upon the sea, and there was a great storm which caused the ship to break apart.

The men didn't want to hurt Jonah by throwing him off the boat so they tried to row the best they could, but the storm just got worse. So, they picked up Jonah and threw him into the sea. The storm immediately calmed, and the sea became still.

The captain and the crew looked out to sea as a huge whale came and swallowed up Jonah. God had sent the whale to swallow Jonah and keep him from drowning.

Go and get a glass of water and a straw to make the sounds of the belly of the whale.

Just think for a second what it would be like to be inside a fish. There are no windows, and lots of strange things floating around that you can't see because it is so dark.

While Jonah was trapped inside the whale, he did a lot of praying to God. He asked God to forgive him for running away. He also thanked God for not allowing him to drown. Jonah was in the belly of the whale for 3 days and nights!

After the third day God told the whale to spit Jonah out onto dry land. And the whale did just that. Jonah was happy to be out of the dark belly of the fish, but oh, did he need a shower. He was slimy and smelly.



The word of God came to Jonah a second time saying:

"Go to Nineveh and give the people there this message." This time Jonah obeyed God and left for Nineveh right away.

Go and get a pair of shoes to be Jonah walking to Nineveh.
