The Clergy Jewish Participation Fund is set up to enable members to participate in Jewish activities that are run and organised by Alyth and other external organisations, without finances being a barrier to participation.

During lockdown, our Professional Team have spoken to members, giving emotional and pastoral support, as well as providing immediate, confidential financial assistance when needed. With the economic uncertainty ahead, our expectation is that requests for support of this nature will increase.

While there have been no requests this Summer to fund attendance on Summer Schemes, trips and Israel Tour, we know that these transformational experiences will resume. Alyth Community Care Fund
