Weekly Learning

Hebrew reading from Scratch

Tuesdays 10, 17, 24 November, 19:00-20:00

Taught by Alyth member Jan Roseman, who has been one of the UK's leading Synagogue-based Jewish educators for the last few decades. Take an hour a week to learn to read Hebrew from scratch.

Pardes Short Course - The Apikoros

Thursdays 12, 19, 26 November, 13:00-14:00

Is Judaism a community of belief? What would it mean to be a Jewish heretic? How did the authors of the Talmud feel about questioning the words of Torah or the edicts of the Rabbis? Join Rabbi Elliott for a 4-week series in which we will delve into these questions through a study of the heretical figure of the Apikoros. We are told that the Apikoros is not worthy of a place in the world to come, but who were they and why did the rabbis of the Talmud find them so threatening to their religious community?

Week 2: Midrash (Sifre Devarim 12:2, Bereshit Rabbah 19:1, y.Sanhedrin 27d-28a)

Week 3: Bavli (b.Sanhedrin 99b-100a) with commentaries

Week 4: Bavli continued, focusing on the story of Rabbi Yochanan, this time with parallel texts (Pesikta deRav Kahana 18:4) and points of comparison (b.Shabbat 30b b.Kiddushin 81b)

Anti-Semitism in the Labour Party - Where are we now?

(Thursday 12 November)

In the first of our special Thursday evening discussions to get us through this second lockdown, we are delighted to welcome Mike Katz, National Movement Chair of the Jewish Labour Movement, and Alyth member Adam Langleben, JLM's Campaign Officer and former Barnet Labour councillor, who left the Labour Party in 2019 and was deeply involved in the EHRC investigation. Together we will discuss the findings of the EHRC report, the events that followed, and the current state of the Labour Party. Is the current Labour Party a safe place for Jews, and if not, what still needs to be done? Hosted by Rabbi Josh.

Civil Rights in Israel

Join Rabbi Josh and guests from ACRI - the Association for Civil Rights in Israel. Founded in 1972, ACRI is a policy driven, non-profit organization protecting the human rights and civil liberties of all people living in Israel and the Occupied Territories. Over the past year, ACRI has worked to protect civil rights in Israel in the context of the Covid crisis including its impact on freedom of expression and personal privacy. We welcome ACRI in conjunction with the New Israel Fund UK. ACRI received one of the New Israel Fund UK's Human Rights Award 2020 at their ceremony last week.

ALYTH CHEVRUTA PROJECT

Coming soon

Beginning in January 2021, the Alyth clergy team invite you to join us in a special learning project for the whole community.

Chavruta is a classical form of Jewish study, in which two people grapple with a text together. The Talmud declares, "Two students learning together sharpen one another".

Throughout January and February 2021, in the lead-up to Purim, the Alyth Chavruta Project will setup and support study in chavruta of Tractate Megillah of the Mishnah.

How will it work?

Every Friday, starting on 1 January, participants will be sent a study pack containing texts, questions and supporting material to study in chavruta. Every Thursday from 19:00-20:00, a member of the clergy team will host a review session looking at the material, and answering questions coming out of the week of study.

How do I find a chavruta partner?

If you have a partner in mind, please approach them directly, and let us know about your pair when the project goes live next month. We can also find you a chavruta partner from within the community. There will be an online form to fill in from the first week in December.

How do I find out more?

There will be an introductory session on Thursday 3 December from 19:00 in which we will explain more. The session will introduce the idea of chavruta, and tips to make it work, as well as introducing Mishnah Megillah.
