Welcome home!

We are delighted to have been able to welcome so many members and friends back into the Alyth building over the last month. Almost one third of our nearly 1600 households have been back to Alyth since we reopened. It has been truly wonderful to see you. We look forward to welcoming more members home during December, including for our Chanukah 'lightings of return'.

We ask for your continued help in keeping Alyth as safe as possible

The best way to make sure that we are all safe at Alyth is for us to work together to avoid bringing Covid into the building. Please remember not to come to Alyth if you are at all unwell. If you are not fully vaccinated, we ask that you take a lateral flow test each time you come into the building.

We still have limited capacity in the Beit Tefillah to avoid overcrowding. Please remember to let us know that you are coming. We are very sorry that for some Erev Shabbat services we have not been able to accommodate everyone who has wanted to come. Unfortunately, at this stage, we are unable to increase capacity further.

When coming into the Alyth building, please remember to bring a mask. Please use the hand sanitiser around the building, and please observe the signs - areas of the building remain closed due to Covid and our building work.

For those who are still unable to return, we will continue to offer as much of our programme online as we can, for as long as we need to.

In December there are even more opportunities to come back to Alyth.

Alyth Chavruta Project Thursdays 2, 9, 16 December, 19:00-20:00

Following our break for summer and the High Holy Days, the Alyth Chavruta Project restarted in November. Chavruta is a traditional form of Jewish practice of studying regularly with a partner. You can decide how and when to study during the week, and then we all come together as a group on Thursday evenings.

In this series of the project, we are working our way through a section of Talmud that contains both legal and narrative sections, along with commentaries and supplementary texts. No prior knowledge is required and the text is accessible for all levels.

Thursday 2 December Chanukah Special with Rabbi Hannah The women of Chanukah

A special session with Rabbi Hannah exploring the stories of Judith and Hannah. How did these narratives come to be associated with Chanukah, and what can we learn from them?

Thursday 9 December Special Guest teacher Rabbi Dr Michael Hilton Why do Chanukah and Christmas both begin on the 25th of the Month?

Join Rabbi Dr Michael Hilton to explore primary sources for the dating of Chanukah and Christmas, and why he believes there is a link. This story takes us down many byways, including Antiochus setting himself up as a God, the winter solstice, Emperor Constantine's conversion to Christianity and the Roman festival of the rebirth of the sun.

Thursday 16 December Pre-Christmas Special with Rabbi Josh Grappling with the concept of Virgin Birth

The Tanakh contains plenty of stories of miracle births, to which the story of the virgin birth is clearly related. Together we will explore some of these stories, and will ask what is different about the foundational Christian story. How do later Jewish texts deal with the idea of virgin birth, and the figure of Mary?

Shabbat Shiur (in-person & online) Saturday 11 December, 9:15-10:15

"It was not you who sent me here, but God": Divine Providence in the story of Joseph

In this week's Torah portion, Joseph reveals his identity to his brothers. He reassures them that he will not take vengeance on them, stating that when they sold him into slavery, this was part of a grand divine plan. How does this idea sit with us? What other aspects of Jewish tradition speak to this idea of Divine Providence? Join Rabbi Elliott to explore these questions.

This session will take place in the synagogue library with windows open, and can also be joined via Zoom. If coming in person, please make sure you let us know you are coming, and remember to dress appropriately.
