GUIDE TO ROSH HASHANAH AT ALYTH

After the challenges of the last two years, it is with great joy that we are once again able to gather as a community to pray, study and reflect together.

Our programme of services and sessions for this year has been created to reflect the diversity of the Alyth community. There will be choral, Kollot, reflective and family services, as well as study and mindfulness sessions, and a full programme run by our Youth and Education Team.

WHERE ARE SERVICES TAKING PLACE THIS YEAR? WHY IS THIS DIFFERENT TO PREVIOUS YEARS?

This year, we will once again offer activities in the Marquee and Manor House at the Sternberg Centre, as well as making full use of available areas of the Alyth building.

PLEASE NOTE: SERVICES AND SESSIONS WILL NOT NECESSARILY TAKE PLACE IN THE SAME LOCATIONS AS IN PREVIOUS YEARS.

THIS INCLUDES BOTH CHORAL AND KOLLOT SERVICES.

There are a number of reasons that we are experimenting this year.

On a practical level, this year we only have two large spaces available to us - the marquee and Alyth's Beit Tefillah. The community has grown and evolved over the last few years to such an extent that we now have three large services that need to share these two spaces. We have therefore had to move one of the Choral and Kollot services back to Alyth - one on Rosh Hashanah and one on Yom Kippur. This will also mean that diverse services will take place in the Beit Tefillah, in which we have invested heavily in high-quality technology for online provision.

Limitations on space mean that we have also had to split the family services over three age-based sittings, introducing a large 'all-families' service on Yom Kippur afternoon in the marquee. This will also allow more of our community to access the Marquee. Last year we received positive feedback from those who have previously been in other locations about the opportunity to pray in the marquee. It feels important to try this again this year.

PLEASE LOOK CAREFULLY AT THE PROGRAMME TO ENSURE THAT YOU ATTEND THE STYLE OF SERVICE THAT BEST MEETS YOUR NEEDS.

JOINING OUR HIGH HOLY DAYS FROM HOME

While many of us are able to join together in person this year, it remains important that we also offer an extensive online programme for those who are not able to join us at Alyth or the Sternberg Centre. For a significant number of our members, in-person attendance is still not possible, and over the last few years we have also found new friends and members around the world.

All services and activities can be joined via Zoom using the links in this booklet. If you unable or prefer not to use Zoom, then the "Zoom screen" from services can also be seen via our YouTube channel (www.youtube.com/c/AlythRS).

The services taking place in the Beit Tefillah offer the best quality zoom experience, including sound. On Rosh Hashanah, this will be our Choral service, and on Yom Kippur morning, our Kollot service. In these services, you can also join the praying community 'in the room' by showing yourself on the screens in the Beit Tefillah.

We invite you to begin your services with our "Kavannot of preparation at home" before logging on.

YOUTH & EDUCATION HUB ACTIVITIES

Young people in Reception to School Year 8 are invited to join our Youth and Education Hub in the Manor House for a rolling programme of arts and crafts, drama, music and much more.

Staffed by our trained madrichim (youth leaders) this area will be a safe space for your children to engage with the High Holy Days.

Please note: All those in School Year 8 and younger will need to be signed in and out of the Manor House space. When in the care of the Alyth Youth and Education team we will ask our members to wear an Alyth wristband so that they are recognisable as Alyth members.

The Youth and Education Hub will have responsibility for children when they are in the Manor House space under their care, but all children are the responsibility of their parents/carers when moving around the Sternberg Centre site.

FAMILY SERVICES

The Heath Extension

Tashlich is a special ritual for Rosh Hashanah afternoon in which we cast our sins into flowing water. Find members of the Alyth staff team, dotted around the heath, to collect the things you need to do your own Tashlich service. You can start with your group anytime between 15:30–16:30. Here's the first clue to get you started...

[Begin on the corner of Wildwood and Hampstead Way where you'll find a member of the Alyth staff team...]

Follow the smallest path in front of you that leads you through the trees.

Enter the clearing.

Ahead you'll see two paths either side of a cluster of trees.

If you were in a boat at sea, you'd steer to the port path.

Once past the trees, spy the sky-pointing spire and walk towards it.

Count the benches and go to the one that shares a number with the creation of the world.

Here you'll meet an Alyth face to give you an item you need.

A guitar led service with new and familiar melodies which will include sung passages for the Malchuyot, Zichronot and Shofarot. Including the sound of shofar. Led by Rabbi Josh.

TORAH LISHMA: LISTENING TO THE RIGHT VOICE (12:00)

Alyth: Meeting Room

Our Torah reading this year for 2nd day Rosh Hashanah is the chapter which precedes the Akedah – in which jealousy prompts Sarah to insist that Hagar and Ishmael are sent away. Is a permanent family feud inevitable? Join Student Rabbi Nicola to look at texts which explore different possible outcomes of this story – and their relevance to our own attempts at repentance and reconciliation.
