Holocaust Memorial Day



Monday, January 27 was International Holocaust Memorial Day and on Tuesday 28 January Alyth hosted a book event as part of our Holocaust Memorial Day programme. Speaking to a packed room, with even more joining online, Alyth member Leslie Michaels and Dr Toby Simpson, Director of The Wiener Holocaust Library, told us about the life of Margrit Hochschild Stern (1921 - 1998), who came to Britain as an unaccompanied child refugee, as well as that of Jews in Germany before the Second World War. Leslie has written a book about Margrit and her family which was sold out on the night.

Rabbi Hannah attended the Barnet Holocaust Memorial Day Ceremony where Katie and our youth choir

represented Alyth and sung some beautiful pieces.

Rabbi Nicola attended Music in Auschwitz: Commemorating Holocaust Memorial Day concert at Wigmore Hall. She also gave the D'Var Torah at the Erev Shabbat Service on Friday 24 January. The D'var Torah can by read by clicking here.

Rabbi Hannah commented; "As the last generation which will hear first hand testimony from survivors, it's essential that we not only listen, but also act to continue to honour their legacy."
